






Memorial Medallion and 41st Anniversary May 15-19 2016 Memorial Coin of the last 41 Names on the Wall

The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States of America is a leader among veterans organizations worldwide. As a Life-Member, and thanks to the members of the Phnom Penh Post #11575, Chuck has transferred to the Post. Led by John Muller, Past Post Commander, and Roy Day, current Commander, the group is and has been active in guaranteeing that the lives lost in May 1975 in the Mayaguez incident are not forgotten—the last 41 names on the wall are of the guys killed in May that year some two weeks after the fall of Saigon on April 30. Known as the Mayaguez Post after the ship involved in the incident, the VFW members feel a deep commitment to bringing VFW's Mission of memorializing those who served and helping in the communities around the world where local peoples need help and support even if only small, but always meaningful, ways. We are honored to have this association.





The Library of Vietnam Project is a proud member of the Vietnam Union of Friendship Organizations (VUFO). This group was formed in 1945, well before the early American military involvement in Vietnam that led up to the full scale war of 1965 to 1975. October 17, 2017 we attended its annual conference.

The interest in American History among the Vietnamese members is high, dating back to well before 1945. One report was about American associations dating back to 1832.

Vietnam Hosted the APEC Meetings in Da Nang November 10. The gathering gave President Trump an opportunity to continue the American tradition of every American President visiting Vietnam since the normalization of relations between the coun-

tries back in 1995. He lauded Vietnam as a world miracle in its development and economic growth in the last 25 years.

In a small way the Library Project since its inception in 1999 has been a part of this opening of Vietnam. Nearly 20 years ago we began the process of building Libraries and changing the very educational infrastructure of Vietnam. Through the incorporation of Library independent study facilities as separate freestanding buildings that play a central role in the development of creative initiative, their influence goes well beyond the standard rote learning that is

well mastered but with its limitations in the basic Vietnamese and Asian education.

At the October meeting we introduced the idea of using the Libraries as Archival sourcing points for family records of injuries because of Agent Orange, as well as landmine and unexploded bombs. It is now under review in Hanoi.

In a meeting with the General Director of the Department of Foreign Affairs of Quang Tri Province October 12, 2017, he recalled with gratitude the plan we advanced nearly 20 years ago for Quang Tri Province to become the first Province in the History of the nation to have a Province-wide Library system with a designated library in each of the 7 Districts—we built it and they remember it.



"ASSIGNMENT VIETNAM"

John Muller, Vietnam 1969-70

CHRISTOPHER W. RUNCKEL has self-published a book, "Assignment Vietnam," here shown in its Vietnamese Edition. Citing John Muller, his "Wing Man," in the Dedication, it is a story of his life, and the central impact Vietnam, at war and peace, has made in it. Runckel began the Vietnam experience with his induction into the US Army in 1969 and continues to this day to work with the Vietnamese people. As the first diplomat assigned to Vietnam after the war he brings a valuable insight into the process of rebuilding relations between two nations after over 10 years of war. From the first returns to Vietnam to Pete Peterson's taking office as the first US Ambassador to Vietnam in 1995, some 20 years after the war ended, the number of people involved from so many walks of life, well beyond the political and diplomatic worlds, is an exercise in hope to rebuild and recapture the working relationships between former enemies in search for a brighter future.

This book dedicated in part to John Muller, a story himself, a Vietnam Veteran and later VFW Post Commander of the Mayaguez VFW Post #11575 of Phnom Penh Cambodia, is a worthwhile read. Like many self-published books it tells a story that needs to be told even if main line publishers are reluctant to take them on.
