ROSS WORLEY, FOUNDER LIBRARY OF LAOS PROJECT JOINS

Four Co-Founders made the journey to Phonsavath, Meuang Feuang, in Laos' Vientiane Province to attend the official signing of the Primary Memorandum of Understanding that officially kicked off the construction of the Khmhu Library Learning Center.

Mayder Lor and her parents, Charles and Payoura, on a double mission which included a week of her teaching in Nong Het along with Ross Worley, Founder of the Library of Laos Project back in 2002, were there. The crowd was, once again, excited and in abundance as Santa later appeared too, first time ever!

Madame Kongdeuane Nettavong, General Director Emeritus of the National Library of Laos, and her successor Madame Khanthamaly, current General Director, attended creating an added significance of the work the Library Project's Co-Founders are funding in this remote area of the Lao PDR.

PHONSAVATH PROJECT GROUNDBREAKING HELD DECEMBER 8, 2017

December 8, 2017 marked the beginning of the Library of Phonsavath Project with the signing of the Primary Memorandum of Understanding. It is located in the new village of Phonsavath, which now serves as home for Khmhu peoples from some 17 surrounding Villages, forced out of their ancestral homes in the region as a result of the Nam Ngum 2 Dam Project.

The challenges faced on construction will include exact situating of the Library on he previously agreed upon lot, the Khmhu Architectural signature, the Western Greco-Roman Pillars and the amended handicapped access ramp limited to the irst floor, increasing the overall inside measurements of the building. With the assurances of Madame Kongdeuane Nettavong and her oversight, direct payment will be made to the accountant for the school. Kr. Keo, Headmaster, is the primary person responsible for construction on the Lao side.

Mrs. Charlie Lor and daughter Mayder presented this plaque to be erected in the Xieng Khouang Library Learning Center American Hmong Legacy Archive. It is a Memorial Plaque with a reach into the past that is very important to the children, past, present and future, of Xieng Khouang. This room has some other Memorabilia of the first American Hmong builders of this first Library ever in Laos' ancient Plain of Jars Region. 

Madame Kongdeuane Nettavong was born in Laos in 1951. Her Grandfather was the last King of the Middle Kingdom of Laos. Her mother was killed in an Air America Plane crash on November 25, 1968 near Savannaket. Gifted, she went to school in Canada and France and returned to her native Laos, the only one of a group of 22 Laotians to do so after the fall of the Lao Republic Government December 12, 1975. She would go on to become the Director of the National Library of Laos. More than that she inspired construction of Libraries across Laos. These plaques have or will appear in every Library with which the Library of Laos has been associated since 2002.

KHE SANH: 50 YEARS LATER... 1968-2018

President Lyndon B. Johnson was faced with what appeared to him to be a decision in early 1968 much as the French faced at Dien Bien Phu 14 years earlier in 1954—-no way would he allow a remote mountain battle to be lost and thus, lose the war. His resolve meant a Siege that carried on from January 21 to July 9,1968. The US Marines with Navy and US Army support managed to avoid such a monumental defeat. The Library Project's personal contact with this historic battle is with the eyes, ears and heart of Chaplain Ray Stubbe, Wauwatosa, Wisconsin.

January 21 2018 marks the 50th Anniversary Commemoration of the Siege. Chaplain Stubbe has throughout his life acted on his commitment to God and to the so very many soldiers to whom he has ministered—- not only throughout the Siege but throughout his life to this very day. He still inspires in Milwaukee with a special life bringing insight and compassion to Veterans over 50 years after the end of the war.

The Sanh "reunites several of the key players from "Cast Away," including Broyles, Hanks and

Elizabeth Gabler, who now heads Fox 2000 and was previously a senior development executive at Fox shepherding "Cast Away." "Bill Broyles is a very serious writer and the things that he writes are born out of his experi-ence and out of his heart," Zwick told The Hollywood Reporter. "He is as authentic and as committed a writer as there is. This screenplay, like ' Apollo 13' and like ' Cast Away' is deeply personal and deeply felt." Zwick is quite familiar with the dramatic military story that is "Khe Sanh." He directed "Glory," "Courage Under Fire" and "The Siege."

"Khe Sanh." He directed "Glory," "Courage Under Fire" and "The Siege." "Khe Sanh." would mark the first pairing for Zwick and Hanks, who have long sought to work together. Zwick is currently producing "Abandon," which marks Stephen Gaghan's directorial debut, and produced with Laura Bickford and his Bedford Falls producing partner Marshall Herskovitz the Steven Soderbergh-directed "Traffic" for USA Films, for which Gaghan wrote the script. Soder-bergh and Gaghan are also nomi-nated for Oscars for "Traffic." Zwick and Herskovitz created and his endford Again." Zwick's feature directing credits also include 1994's "Legends of the Fall," "Leaving Normal" and "About Last Night." He is also developing projects with John Logan and Christopher McQuar-rie for Warner Bros.

Ray Stubbe wrote a 1,500 page diary during his service at the Siege at Khe Sanh. The tome was purchased back in 2001 for a movie as detailed in The Hollywood Reporter March 22, 2001.

The movie has not been made to date but the production is reportedly "still in play" as a Vietnam War story. Ray has moved on with several books and Founded the Khe Sanh Veterans Association.

CLI Reader's Corner

John Prados & Ray W. Stubbe, Published 1991 Naval Institute Press, Annapolis, Maryland



Chaplain Ray Stubbe is an inspiration and co-sponsor of our Library at Khe Sanh, Vietnam. Founder of the original Khe Sanh Veterans Association and author of several books on the Siege that began January 21, 1968, 50 Years ago, he has a story of his own that spans a lifetime of giving to his fellow man. The book details the story of Khe Sanh for posterity.

Widely acknowledged as the definitive history of the siege of Khe Sanh when first published in hardcover in 1991, this book tells the whole incredible story of one of the most pivotal and bloody battles of the Vietnam War. Historian John Prados and Khe Sanh survivor Ray Stubbe recount the brutal seventy-seven days of combat and present the larger political context that formed the allimportant backdrop to the events on the battlefield in 1968.

From the first direct hit on the fifteen-hundred tons of ammunition stockpiled in the U.S. compound, through the day and night patrols, pounding mortar fire, and shifting battle lines, the words and deeds of the men of Khe Sanh are brought to life with a skillful combination of documentation and eyewitness accounts-from both sides of the conflict. Unique among books about the war, the comprehensiveness of this study will satisfy the most demanding specialist.
